CMC General Guidelines

Scenario A – In-Person National Audition

The National Audition will take place in performance halls—closed to the public, before three regional judges who will evaluate the auditions in person, in real time. Two permanent judges will evaluate all of the candidates remotely at a later date, based on recordings produced by the CMC-Canimex; they will ensure a national evaluation by listening to the candidates from across the country, by age and instrument category. The jury will be made up of a total of 5 members. The rules and repertoire requirements have been revised to reflect the unique nature of this edition. The provision of results and meetings with the judges will take place virtually, based on the procedure formulated by the CMC. There will be no National Final and Gala Concert.

Scenario B - Non-Competitive

If access to performance halls—a key criteria in ensuring fairness for all of our participants—is compromised, the 2021 competitive edition will be transformed into a non-competitive edition. This replacement solution (non-competitive) may be applied to an instrument category, a region, or to all candidates, depending on how the pandemic progresses. If need be, participants will be invited to submit a video recording consisting of one or more works from the previously submitted repertoire. A 5-member committee will evaluate the performances and, without assigning a score or ranking, vote for their favourite. Naming of favourites will be at the CMC's discretion and will reflect the extent of the application of the non-competitive process (to one or more instrument categories, to one region, or to all candidates); terms and conditions will be specified in due course.

Conditions for implementing Scenario B

The trigger for switching to a non-competitive format is the inability to access a performance hall. Scenario B can come into effect at the regional and/or national level:

- 1. For an instrument category, if candidates registered in that category do not have access to the performance hall.
- 2. At the regional level, if all candidates or some of the candidates do not have access to the performance hall OR if at least two (2) regional judges are not in a position to proceed with in-person evaluations OR if the volunteer team is compromised.
- 3. At the national level, if access to performance halls is compromised for at least two (2) chapters among the following: Vancouver, Calgary, Toronto, Montréal.

As long as Condition 3 is not met and that the in-person National Audition remains possible at the national level, the CMC will do all it can to maintain the competitive aspect for candidates who have already been heard by the time Scenario B (non-competitive) comes into effect. In the event that Condition 3 is met, all candidates—whether or not they have already been heard when Scenario B (non-competitive) comes into effect—will automatically be evaluated according to the non-competitive criteria.

Common Guidelines

- Everyone in attendance at the audition site must: complete the form declaring compliance with guidelines and awareness of the risks upon arrival on the premises; authorize the CMC to take his/her temperature using an infrared thermometer; follow indications and signage regarding entering and exiting; respect the schedules set by the CMC; comply with the above-mentioned public health regulations.
- The public will not be admitted to the audition sites. Only candidates who are minors may be accompanied by one (1) parent who will not be permitted to enter the audition room; accompanists and candidates of legal age must come on their own.
- Anyone exhibiting virus-like symptoms (fever, appearance or worsening of a dry cough, severe fatigue, aches and pains, sore throat, diarrhea, conjunctivitis, headache, etc.) will automatically be refused admission to the audition site.
- The CMC will provide hand sanitizing equipment.
- The CMC and the performance hall manager will make sure that all surfaces used will be disinfected.
- The performance hall manager will ensure that the premises are sufficiently ventilated.

Important Rules

Candidates who register for the Competition acknowledge that they have read and understood the CMC's rules, including, but not limited to, the following:

1. Registration

- 7. Candidates participating in CMC activities do so knowing the risks involved and accept that the CMC may not be held liable for any loss or damages caused by any virus, bacteria, or microorganism. Candidates must comply with the CMC Health and Safety Protocol regarding public health standards.
- 8. If access to performance halls—a key criteria in ensuring fairness for all of our participants—is compromised, the 2021 competitive edition will be transformed into a non-competitive edition. This replacement solution may be applied to an instrument category, a region, or to all candidates, depending on how the pandemic progresses.

3. Registration Fees (<u>registration terms</u>)

- 2. Registration fees can be reimbursed, less the applicable administrative fees, for cancellations made before **February 18, 2021**. No refunds will be given after this date. Candidates registered for the Competition who have not confirmed their intention to step down before the deadline accept that the 2021 edition may potentially be transformed into a non-competitive edition if health and safety conditions warrant it and they will not be reimbursed.
- 3. Exceptionally, if a candidate is unable to participate in the National Audition due to a serious injury/illness (a positive COVID-19 test may be considered as a serious illness), the CMC may reimburse the registration fees, less the applicable administrative fees, upon receipt of a doctor's note. Supporting documents should be sent to the National Office within a reasonable time following the announcement of the injury. The decision to accept the reason for cancellation or not is at the entire discretion of the National Office. Following the National Audition, no refunds for serious injury will be accepted.

7. Punctuality

1. Candidates must arrive at the precise convocation time set for their audition. A candidate who does not respect this directive may be disqualified.

9. Evaluation and Results

- 5. In the event that the 2021 Edition is transformed into a non-competitive edition no marks or places will be attributed.
- 6. Whether the 2021 edition of the Canimex CMC is competitive or not, candidates will receive written comments from the evaluators and will be able to meet with them virtually—format to be determined.

10. Awards and Scholarships

- 5. In the event that the 2021 edition is transformed into a non-competitive edition, no Prizes nor scholarships will be awarded.
- 6. In the context of a non-competitive edition, the 5 members of the evaluation committee will be asked to vote for their favourites in the major age categories and major regions represented. The naming of favourites is done so at the CMC's discretion and will reflect the extent of the application of the non-competitive format (limited to one or more instrument categories, to a region, or to all candidates); terms and conditions will be specified in due course.
